From the Pastor's heart

"Hurry up—let's go so we can come back." It was something I heard regularly growing up. My parents, like so many, were always trying to get my brother and me into the car and out the door as quickly as possible—so we could get wherever we were going and, hopefully, return home just as fast. For years, I adopted that same pace. I hurried my kids through morning routines. I rushed through errands, tasks, studying, work, even play—just to be done quicker. Efficiency can be beneficial, but is it always valuable?

When I rush, I risk missing what matters most. In my speed to tidy up, I may be overlooking opportunities to truly connect. And in my desire to get things done fast, I could be missing the holy, everyday moments with my children—the ones that don't come back. Not long ago, I was at a very long event in a venue with no air conditioning. It was stifling. Everyone was hot, sticky, tired, and ready to leave—including me. At the moment when I thought it would be an oppoturtune time to exit, someone stopped me. It was a woman I had just met, and we had briefly connected over the challenges and beauty of raising children with autism. That "quick goodbye" turned into a 45-minute conversation, full of depth, understanding, and encouragement. Today, we continue to message and support each other. A new friendship bloomed because I paused. We can't stop to smell every rose, but what if we challenged ourselves to slow down more often?

Even God didn't rush. He could have spoken the entire universe into being in an instant. But instead, He created the world in six days. Day by day. Detail by detail. With thought and intention, He shaped flowers, trees, oceans, stars—and us. Every living thing crafted uniquely. Every human formed with care. What a beautiful invitation to slow down and notice the details, the people, the moments. This summer, as the warm Alberta sun moves swiftly across the sky, I hope you'll pause. Take in the moment. Linger a little longer. Appreciate each task, each blessing, each opportunity God gives you. "Be still, and know that I am God." —Psalm 46:10

DIVE INTO "WATER SAFETY" this summer!
