From the Paston's heart

We found ourselves waiting this week—Orlando and I were at the AMA in Red Deer, needing to sort out some insurance paperwork. And we waited. For what felt like forever.

You know the drill. You scan the room, count how many people are ahead of you, and start estimating how long it might take. Then you realize there's only one agent working, and suddenly the anticipation kicks into overdrive. Maybe it's just me, but I really like to know what's coming next. Being organized, prepared, in control—it feels good, right? I imagine that if life came with a countdown timer, we'd all be a lot calmer.

A timer would tell me when the specialist will call to book that appointment. When my son will text me back. When the refund cheque will arrive in the mail. No surprises. No spinning thoughts. Just certainty.

But life doesn't work that way. And in the absence of that countdown, the waiting room becomes a breeding ground for anxiety. That's why Paul's words in Philippians 4:6 hit so deeply: "Don't be anxious about anything; rather, bring up all of your requests to God in your prayers and petitions, along with giving thanks."

It sounds so simple. But honestly? It's a real struggle to live out. The Greek word used here for "anxious"—μεριμνάω—means more than just feeling nervous. It literally means to be pulled apart in different directions. Paul isn't just saying, "don't stress." He's saying, don't let your thoughts tear your mind to pieces.

I don't know what you're waiting for or what you're waiting in—but I pray your mind isn't being pulled in a thousand directions. In every circumstance—every line, every unanswered question, every "what if"—God invites us to respond with worship at the same time bringing every request to Him.

And here's the part that challenges me: we're invited to come to God with thanksgiving —before we know the outcome. Gratitude in the waiting. Gratitude in the unknown. Friends, this is hard, but don't let it stop you from sharing everything on your heart with God. Even if it's being called next at the insurance office, because, somehow, even in the waiting, He's working.
